Optometrists are advised the fee for comprehensive eye exams for children referred by public health from the enhanced vision screening program is increasing from 20.48 MSU (\$70.04) to 23.58 MSU (\$80.65) retroactively effective August 1, 2024. The exam has its own health service code 09.02F in the tariff of fees for publicly insured optometric services.

09.02F Comprehensive Eye Examination:

SP=OPTO 23.58

(with public health nurse referral from Enhanced Vision Screening Program)

Billing Guidelines

The exam is eligible for school aged children (age 4 – 19 years)
with referral from the Enhanced Vision Screening Program

This increase will automatically apply to any claims submitted with a date of service on and after September 27, 2024. Claims submitted with a date of service from August 1 – September 26, 2024 will be identified and a retroactive payment will be sent to optometrists once the 90-day submission window has elapsed.

An update to the Optometry Guide to reflect this change will be made soon.

COMPLEX PATIENT - REMINDER

A 'complex patient' is a patient who presents with <u>at least two</u> of the following conditions, <u>as indicated by diagnostic codes submitted on the claim</u>:

- 3669 existing cataracts
- 36250 age-related macular degeneration
- 36201 diabetic retinopathy
- 3659 glaucoma
- 3643 or 74346 uveitis

Optometrists are reminded when submitting their claim to MSI for a complex patient, they <u>must include the two</u> conditions presented at the visit as diagnostic codes in <u>the MSI claim</u>.

Failing to include the qualifying two conditions in the diagnosis of the MSI claim could result in \$0 payment.
